





Color Jenga (LEGO Edition) – Rules

Setup:

- 1. Build the Tower:
 - Stack the LEGO bricks into a tower with three bricks per layer.
 - Each layer should be placed **perpendicular** to the one below it.
 - The starting tower should have 18 layers (54 bricks in total), following the traditional Jenga setup.
- 2. Use Six Colors:
 - The bricks must be arranged randomly, but each layer should contain three different colors to keep the game balanced.
 - The six colors in play:
 - Yellow
 - White
 - Black
 - Red
 - Dark Bluish Gray
 - Light Bluish Gray
- 3. The Color Die:
 - A six-sided die is used in Color Game Mode.
 - Each side of the die corresponds to one of the six colors in the game.

Gameplay:

Classic Mode:

- Players take turns removing **one brick** from any layer below the highest complete layer.
- A player can only use one hand to remove and place bricks.
- Bricks may be tested for looseness but must be returned if the player chooses another brick.
- The removed brick must be placed on **top of the tower**.
- The game ends when the tower collapses. The last player to **successfully place a brick before the collapse** is the winner!

Color Game Mode (With the Die):

- 1. Roll the Die:
 - On their turn, a player rolls the six-sided die.
 - The color rolled determines which brick they must remove from the tower (Brick of the same color of the die).
- 2. Brick Removal:
 - If the color rolled is **not available**, the player chooses a color.
 - The player **must follow all the standard removal rules** (one hand, no removing from the top layer, etc.).
- 3. Placing the Brick:
 - The removed brick is placed **on top of the tower**.

4. Winning:

- The game ends when the tower collapses.
- The last player to successfully place a brick before the collapse wins!

Credits:

The concept of Color Jenga is inspired by the classic game of Jenga, originally created by Leslie Scott and published by Hasbro. Jenga is a game of physical skill that challenges players to carefully remove and stack blocks without toppling the tower.

The idea of incorporating color into Jenga has been explored in various adaptations and variants, such as Throw 'n Go Jenga, which introduced colored blocks and additional gameplay mechanics.

I am not sure who the original creator of a color-based Jenga adaptation is, but I found inspiration through multiple sources, including various Jenga variants and stacking games. This LEGO version of Color Jenga is a tribute to the timeless gameplay of Jenga, enhanced with a vibrant, modular twist using LEGO bricks.

Thank you to Leslie Scott for creating the original Jenga game, and to the many designers who have experimented with variations of this classic game over the years. Your creativity continues to inspire new ways to enjoy this iconic game.
